HIV/AIDS Statistics

- ~ 1 million people living with HIV/AIDS in the United States
- ~ 250,000 don't know they are infected
- ~ 55,000 new HIV infections every year in the United States

- ~ Estimated 229,000 people living in Michigan who are at risk for HIV due to substance abuse

Overdose Prevention Training

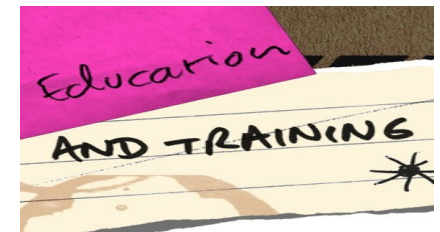
